

Report on Donation of Books and Stationery and Nukkad Natak Conducted on the Theme "Beti Padhao, Beti Bachao" by GITS UHV CELL

Event Overview

On May 8, 2024, the UHV (Universal Human Values) Cell of GITS (Geetanjali Institute of Technical Studies) organized a community outreach event at Mahatma Gandhi School in Dabok. The event focused on promoting education and empowerment of girls under the national campaign "Beti Padhao, Beti Bachao" (Educate the Daughter, Save the Daughter). This report highlights the activities conducted, including the donation of books and stationery, and a nukkad natak (street play) performed by GITS students.



Donation of Books and Stationery

In a bid to support the educational needs of the students, particularly the girls, GITS UHV Cell arranged for the donation of essential educational materials. The donations included:

- Books: A collection of over 300 books covering a wide range of subjects, including textbooks, storybooks, and reference materials.
- Stationery: Sets of notebooks, pens, pencils, erasers, rulers, and other necessary stationery items were distributed.



These resources were intended to provide the students with the tools they need to succeed academically and to alleviate some of the financial burdens on their families.

Nukkad Natak on "Beti Padhao, Beti Bachao"
